



Malmö – City tour 4 hours

Optional start in Copenhagen and visit the new urban area Ørestaden – a new part of Copenhagen near the airport with modern architecture and exciting buildings.

Malmö is Sweden's third largest city and there are about 300,000 inhabitants. Sweden's third city can't be beaten for sea views, cosmopolitan living and an imposing mix of architecture.

One of the greatest things about Malmö is the sea. Many other cities have sea views, but in Malmö it is different - it has a 180-degree view, which is very atmospheric. There is a lot going on at the waterfront: people play sports, have a walk, swim and go sailing.

You are doing a photo-peak at the Oresund Bridge, the link between Sweden and Denmark. Here you are treated to spectacular views over the Sound and in good weather glimpse also of Denmark on the other side. Finally before you return to Denmark again -

Visit Katrinetorp a fine stately home and estate that lies on the southern edge of Malmö. The beautiful house was built in 1813. Its gardens are divided between a section inspired by romantic English gardens and a more symmetrical and ordered section on the French pattern.

Visit the new area with spectacular building constructions for hotels, biggest mall in Europe and more to give Malmö this feeling of being old and newborn at the same time.

The tour continues through the central parts of Malmö. We will take you to famous places and buildings that Malmöhus Castle, and the Turning Torso, in the western harbour. In 200 the first European Housing Expo: Bo01 "The Green City of Tomorrow" was created in an urban district in Malmö's Western Harbour. When Malmö hosted Bo01, it took the first step in transforming the seafront area into an ecologically sustainable residential housing district with biodiversity found in the rich vegetation of its parks, courtyards, streets, squares, walls and roofs.

One part of Malmö is the residential area of Augustenborg one of Sweden's largest urban sustainability projects. The project was launched in 1998 and the results so far indicate that Augustenborg has become an attractive, multicultural neighbourhood. The world's first botanical roof garden is situated within a residential neighbourhood, atop 9,500 m² of industrial buildings.

Optional: lunch at Katrinetorp or in the harbour.
